

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

Scripture

Romans 1:16-17; 3:23; 5:8-11; 6:23; 10:9-13

Session Summary

Through faith in Jesus, our sin is placed on Jesus who was nailed to the cross and His righteousness is given to us (Rom. 5:12-21). Our sin is erased by His blood, and because of His sacrifice, sin is rendered powerless, death is defeated, and the evil one is dethroned in our lives (Col. 2:14-15). Our sin deserves God's wrath, and if not for the cross, we would remain relationally separated from God. But through faith in Jesus, both Jews and Gentiles are given what we could not earn—the righteousness of Jesus, which makes us right in God's sight.

Conversation Questions

- Which verse stood out to you most during the reading?
- If sin no longer separates us from God, what does it look like to have a relationship with Him?
- What does it mean that we have the righteousness of Jesus?
- Why should the gospel motivate us to share with others?

Family Challenge

Memorize these verses in Romans over the next few weeks as a family. Begin with Romans 1:16-17, then move to each Scripture reference once memorized. Write down the verses on note cards and hang them around the house to remind each of you daily.
