

How Do You Stack (C)up?

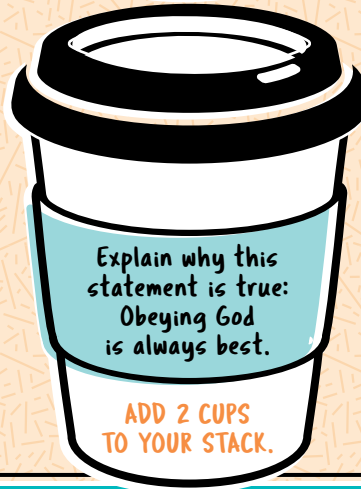
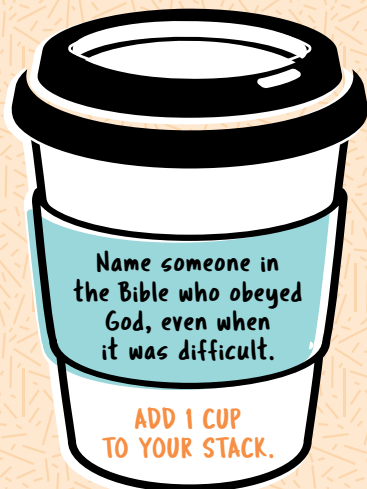

CONVERSATION

Joshua and Jericho

JOSHUA 6:1-21

The Israelites were finally in the promised land, and one of the first cities they saw was Jericho. The people of Jericho had closed their city gates tightly so that no one could come in or go out. A thick, heavy wall surrounded Jericho. The wall was guarded. No one entered the city, and no one left.

God told Joshua, "I have given Jericho, its king, and its army to you. March around the city with your soldiers. Do that one time each day for six days. Seven priests should carry ram's horn trumpets as they walk in front of the ark of the covenant." The ark of the covenant was a gold-covered box that contained the stone tablets with the Ten Commandments and some other important things.

God continued, "On the seventh day, march around the city seven times while the priests blow their trumpets. Then shout a mighty shout! The wall will fall, and the people can go into the city."

Joshua explained the plan to the people. He did as God commanded and placed seven priests with seven trumpets in front of the ark. Some of the soldiers marched in front of the priests, and others came behind the ark. Joshua said, "Do not say one word until I say, 'Shout!'"

Each day for six days, the priests blew their trumpets while the soldiers marched quietly one time around Jericho. Then they all returned to their camp. Early on the seventh day, the priests and soldiers marched around the city seven times. After the seventh time, the priests blew their horns, and Joshua ordered, "Shout! The Lord has given you the city!"

The soldiers gave a great shout when they heard the trumpets, and the wall fell down! The soldiers moved into the city and captured it, just as God had commanded.
