Did You Know?

The trees for Solomon's temple were cut down and chopped into such huge logs that they had to come up with a strange plan to get them to Jerusalem. After they were cut, the logs were tied together to make large rafts. Then they were floated on the sea to a place closer to where the temple was being built.



The Truth in the Trees

When Solomon built the temple, workers cut down many cedar and cypress trees to make the beautiful building. Check out the tree stump. Can you read the message on the growth rings?

Solomon Built the Temple

1 KINGS 6; 8

Four years after Solomon became king, he began to build God's temple. God gave Solomon detailed instructions. The temple would be 90 feet long, 30 feet wide, and 45 feet high.

God promised that if Solomon would follow God's commands and obey Him, God would always live among the Israelites and never leave them.

Solomon used panels of cedar wood, bronze, gold, and stone in the temple, and he gave special attention to every detail. The most holy part of the temple was the inner sanctuary. This place would hold the ark of the covenant, which had been with the people as they traveled with Moses in the wilderness.

After seven years, the temple was complete. All the people gathered as the priests carried the ark of the covenant into the temple. When the priests came out, a cloud filled the temple, and God's glory was in the cloud. "Blessed be the God of Israel!" Solomon said. "God promised my father, David, that his son would build a temple. God kept His promise!"


Solomon stood in front of all of the people and spread out his arms toward heaven. He prayed, "Lord, there is no God like You in heaven above or on earth below!" As Solomon prayed, he thought about the future. He knew the people would sin again, so he asked for forgiveness. He also asked God to hear their prayers.

After Solomon's prayer, he said to the Israelites, "Let your hearts be completely devoted to God. Obey Him in all things." Solomon sacrificed 22,000 cattle and 120,000 sheep to dedicate the temple to the Lord. Solomon and all of Israel celebrated for 14 days. On the 15th day, Solomon sent the people away. They blessed the king and went home to their tents. They rejoiced and thanked God for His goodness.
