
God Gave the Commandments

EXODUS 19-20; 31:18

The Israelites were camped near Mount Sinai. God called Moses to the top of the mountain and said, "Remind the people what I did when I rescued them from the Egyptians. If they listen to Me and obey Me, they will be My holy nation."

Moses gave God's message to the people, and they agreed to obey God.

God told Moses that He would speak in a thick cloud. Moses told the people to prepare to hear God and not to go near the mountain.



The people heard a loud trumpet. They saw

lightning and heard thunder. Smoke covered Mount Sinai, and it shook. God appeared to Moses in a fire on top of the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for 40 days. God gave Moses two stone tablets. On the tablets were the Commandments that God wrote with His own finger.

- 1. I am the Lord your God. Do not have any other gods but Me.
- 2. Do not make or worship statues or idols that look like anything on the earth or in the sky.
- 3. Honor and respect God's name. Do not use God's name in a bad way.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Work six days and rest on the seventh.
- 5. Honor and respect your father and mother.
- 6. Do not murder.
- 7. Keep your marriage promises to your husband or wife.
- 8. Do not steal.
- 9. Do not lie.
- 10. Do not want something that belongs to someone else.

The people trembled and stood at a distance. Moses said to them, "Don't be afraid. Listen to the Commandments and obey them. The Lord our God has spoken from heaven so that you will know how to live and not sin. We will be His people if we keep His Commandments."
