Dear Parents and Students,

As we begin the school year, we can all agree that it is so different than previous years. In fact, 2020 has been a year unlike any other. As our staff has reflected on the last several months and all that was lost, we have looked forward with great anticipation of what may come. Our staff has repeated this phrase often over the last several months, "The Lord is still working." It is a phrase that we all know and believe, but there are times we need to repeat it. 1. Launch Date: August 5, 2020

2. Wednesday Worship Times: Wednesdays at 6:30pm.

- **3. Wednesday Worship Location:** MS and HS students will worship together at The Hill Worship Center for the Fall semester. We will decide on location for the Spring semester at the new year.
- **4. Face Coverings and Mask:** Mask will be required during worship on campus at QSBC because social distancing cannot consistently be practiced. We are also following the school model which is requiring mask to be worn.
- **5. Social Distancing:** We will do our best to make sure social distancing is practiced when students are gathered at The Hill. We will promote social distancing in our gatherings. We will do our best to provide signage and markings that remind students of the importance of social distancing. Seating in The Hill Worship Center will be marked off like the Chapel and Worship Center on the main campus. A mask is required because it cannot be certain that students and leaders will be able to practice consistent social distance.
- **6. Hygiene:** We will also provide hand sanitizer in The Hill Worship Center and The Hill Foyer so that students and leaders have ample opportunity to practice good hygiene. We will encourage leaders and students to wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. We will encourage all leaders and students to cover coughs and sneezes with tissue or use the inside of their elbows.
- **7. Cleaning:** We will clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at least daily and shared objects in between uses. We will also develop a schedule of increased, routine cleaning and disinfection of areas our students and leaders will be in.
- **8. Possible Symptoms:** If a student or leader does not feel well or is showing possible symptoms, we ask that they do not come Wednesday night worship. If a student or leader begins to show symptoms or not feel well while at Wednesday worship, we will immediately dismiss them to go home and inform the families of those who were with them.
- **9. Online Option:** We will offer an online devotion for our students to watch on our QSBC student ministry YouTube account. This will just be the message from the Wednesday night. It will be available each Wednesday at 6:30pm.
- **10. Food:** We will be offering at limited café with candy and drinks at the Hill, the cost is \$1 for everything.

2020-2021 Connect Group Information

1. Launch Date: August 16, 2020

- **2. Connect Group Meeting Locations:** The Hill Worship Center, The Hill Foyer, and The Student Center. On August 16, 2020, all students will meet in the Student Center (9:30 hour) and The Hill Worship Center (11:00 Hour) to find out their new connect group and location.
- **3. Individual Connect Group Rooms:** Connect Group Leaders will choose a location for their group, students will be informed on Sunday August 16, 2020. We know that our current connect group rooms are smaller and may not be able to allow for proper social distancing, so we will be utilizing larger rooms such as the worship rooms in the student center, The Hill worship center, and The Hill foyer to allow for students to space out.
- **4. Face Coverings and Mask:** Mask will be required during connect group meetings because social distancing cannot consistently be practiced. There are two exceptions to this:
 - A. If students are participating in an outdoor activity or connect group.
 - B. If students are appropriately and properly social distanced indoors.
- **5. Social Distancing:** We will do our best to make sure social distancing is practiced when students are gathered in the Student Center or The Hill. Trek-X was launched in 2001 as

"Mobilizing Students". What is now Trek-X, which means ¬Journey with Christ, helps provide mission teams to come and reach the nations by providing an infrastructure to work through. They host teams, like us, and are missionally living among cities where there are huge amounts of refugees. Don and Billie have 25 years of overseas service among unreached peoples. Their desire to train & launch students, young adults, and families is contagious, allowing them to provide the kind of coaching and guidance needed to fully equip all leaders who train and serve on Team Dallas.

Totals

Trip Purpose: Share Christ and strengthen church planting efforts. To accelerate the reach of our Trek-X Field Reps & Gap Year students who live and train here year-round.

Ministry Activities: A variety of efforts such as prayer walks, relational evangelism, DBS/VBS, block parties, English clubs, music & movies, sharing meals, could be used to engage the people here.

Geographic Information: Over 7.1 million people live in the Dallas Metro. Dallas is a modern metropolis in north Texas, and a commercial and cultural hub of the region.

Health Considerations: Staying hydrated will be a priority. There will also be a lot of walking involved.

Lodging and Transportation: The team will stay a local church that is connected with Trek-X. They will sleep on air mattresses. They will drive rental vans from OKC to Dallas and use those vans to get around the city.

Deposit and Trip Cost: \$585 (\$125 nonrefundable deposit has to be turned in with application by September 27, 2020). Because logistics are still being determined, the full cost of the trip and a payment plan will be given at the first mission trip meeting on November 1, 2020.

Registration: All participants are required to register and pay the nonrefundable deposit online at qsbc.org/student-mission-trips by September 27, 2020. In order to secure your spot the application, online registration, and deposit must be turned in.

Trip Purpose: Our hope for this group is to help serve the community and congregation and see lives transformed by the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Ministry Activities: (a) Engage neighborhoods around the church; (b) serve the homeless community; (c) partner with other ministries to meet needs in the county; (d) service projects; (e) praying with people; and (f) serving the congregation through a variety of ways.

Health Considerations: We will walk a lot and be outside a lot.

Lodging and Transportation: The team will stay at Camp Santa Cruz. They will fly to San Francisco or San Jose and then use rental vans to get around the city.

Deposit and Trip Cost: \$1,000 (\$125 nonrefundable deposit due September 27, 2020). Because logistics are still being determined, the full cost of the trip and a payment plan will be given at the first mission trip meeting on November 1, 2020. If you withdraw from the trip after the plane tickets are purchased, you are responsible to pay for your ticket.

Registration: All participants are required to register and pay the nonrefundable deposit online at qsbc.org/student-mission-trips by September 27, 2020. In order to secure your spot the application, online registration, and deposit must be turned in.

- **10. Announcements:** We will not be doing our traditional large group announcement time starting August 23, 2020. Students will find their connect group leaders when it is time to begin and go straight to connect groups.
- 11. Attendance: We will not be using iPads for our check in during this season. Connect Group leaders will fill out their attendance roster in each group and a director will come by and input attendance in. This will help eliminate multiple students touching the same surface.
- 12. Online Connect Group: We will offer an online option for each of our small groups. When connect group assignments are made, students will then have the option to log in either at 9:30 or 11:00 to the correct Zoom link and engage with their connect group. We are asking that connect group leaders communicate the zoom link with each of their group members so that students can stay connected virtually if they are not attending in person.

Partner Church Information: We will be working with UK-USA Ministries. We will be working in Sunderland, United Kingdom. We will be partnering with Sunderland Southwick Community Church and Wearside Youth for Christ.

Trip Purpose: Evangelism and Discipleship. To come alongside the local churches here who are under resourced and struggling to help reach a new generation for Christ and connect them to the local body of believers.

Ministry Activities: Camp of Champions (sports day camp)/ Service Projects / Partnering with a Church Plant in Southwick, Soucthwick Community Church. Everything we do centers around the local church. Building relationships for the purpose of the advancement of the gospel is our primary focus.

Geographic Information: Northeast of England. 60-75 degrees F. Post Christian Culture. Mostly underdeveloped economically and spiritually for dry and challenging.

Health Considerations: No need for any shots.

Lodging and Transportation: We are working on housing currently. The team could stay in host homes, a hotel, or a hostel/retreat type center. UK-USA Ministries will provide all local transport.

Deposit and Trip Cost: \$2,700 (\$125 nonrefundable deposit due September 27, 2020). Because logistics are still being determined, the full cost of the trip and a payment plan will be given at the first mission trip meeting on November 1, 2020. If you withdraw from the trip after the plane tickets are purchased, you are responsible to pay for your ticket.

Registration: All participants are required to register and pay the nonrefundable deposit online at qsbc.org/student-mission-trips by September 27, 2020. In order to secure your spot the application, online registration, and deposit must be turned in.

- **8. Possible Symptoms:** If a student or leader does not feel well or is showing possible symptoms, we ask that they do not come to D-Groups. If a student or leader begins to show symptoms or not feel well while in D-Groups, we will immediately dismiss them to go home and inform the families of those who were in the group with them.
- **9. Attendance:** We will not be using iPads for our check in during this season. D-Group leaders will text their attendance to student ministry staff each week. This will help eliminate multiple students touching the same surface.
- **10. Online D-Groups:** We will offer online option for D-Groups. Students may be put in an all online d-group, some D-Groups will be set up as hybrids where some might be in person while others are logged in through zoom. Students will have options to consider when it comes to participating in D-Groups this school year.


