Partner Church Staff/Leadership Information: After living in the Bay Area for eight years, the Drew and Shannon Cunningham sensed a clear call from God to plant a new church in Santa Cruz County. Drew and Shannon have been married since June of 2007 and have three children (Carsyn, Cruz and Ruby). They love living in Santa Cruz County and genuinely love the people God continues to bring in their path. Drew loves his family, surfing, music and pretty much anything outdoors. Church is casual, so there is no real need for super formal clothing, and many projects have the potential to get messy. It will be up to you if you want to bring a swimsuit (again, modest please). Wetsuits are almost always a must because of the water temperature, but you can decide that for yourselves.

Lodging and Transportation: The team will stay at Camp Santa Cruz. They will fly to either San Jose or San Francisco and then use rental vans to get around the city.

Deposit and Trip Cost: \$125 nonrefundable deposit. Because logistics are still being determined, the full cost of the trip and a payment plan will be given at the first mission trip meeting on October 14, 2018. If you withdraw from the trip after the plane tickets are purchased, you are responsible to pay for your ticket. Give payments to Student Ministry Staff or place in the mailboxes in the student building.
